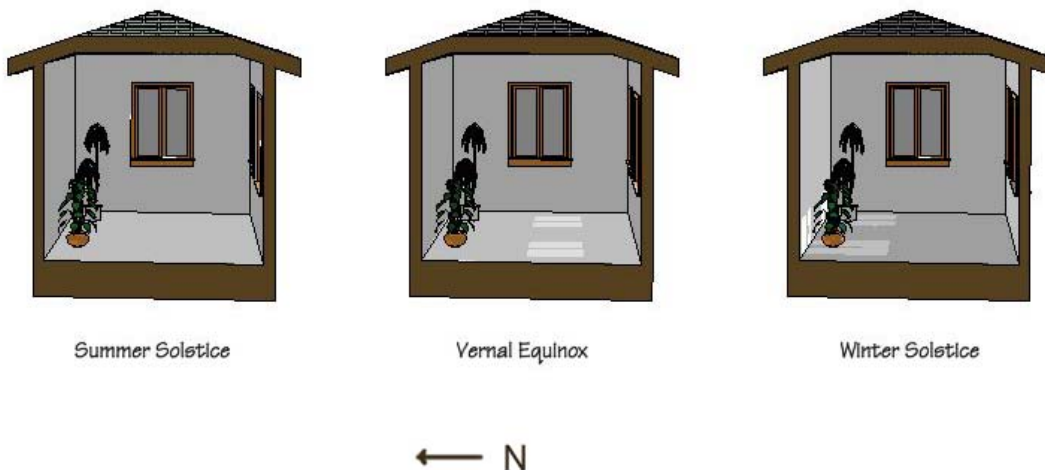


Growing Indoor Plants

How do I choose a suitable plant? | Helping your plant adjust to its new home

View of a small room with houseplants at noon during solstices and equinox, in Davis, California. Indoor plants with southern exposures generally receive more light than northern exposures do, so south facing windows can be good places to locate newly acquired plants while they acclimatize. Indoor plants located in these locations receive more direct light in winter (above, right) than they do in summer (above, left). In California, this phenomenon tends to be stronger the farther north you are.
