OPEN RABBIT SHOW

This is an official American Rabbit Breeders sanctioned show. P.O. Box 5667, Bloomington, IL 61702.

ARBA Membership Dues:

Adult \$15 per year or \$40 for 3 yrs Youth: \$8 per year or \$20 for 3 yrs

Combination Husband/Wife: \$20 per year or \$50 for 3 yrs

Family: \$20 plus \$2 per youth or \$50 plus \$6 per youth for 3 yrs

Rules:

1. This show is a one-day, carrying cage show. No food for animals will be provided.
2. Entry closing date is May 5, 2009. Make sure entry forms are COMPLETELY filled out, including phone number, zip code and email address. State breed and variety of rabbits on entry form. Fees must accompany entry form. Make all checks payable to: Contra Costa Fair, 1201 West 10th Street, Antioch, CA 94509.
3. No new entries will be accepted after entry closing.
4. Any exhibitor's check that is returned must pay entry fees and any applicable bank charges in cash or money order prior to time of judging.
5. Ear mark: All rabbits must have a permanent ear mark in their left ear. Earmark must be readable and correspond to entry form.
6. Sale of animals will be allowed.
7. All animals are entered at the owner's risk. Fair Management and/or judges are not to be held responsible for death or injury to animals. Every precaution will be taken for their safety.
8. The Show Committee reserves the right to reject any entry and shall decide any and all questions arising which are not covered by these specific rules. All parties agree to abide by such decision.

9. Exhibitors are responsible for getting their animals to the judging tables. There will be no carriers. Classes will not be rejudged if exhibitor does not bring their animals to the table when called.
10. Changes/substitutions: See State rule 11-12.
11. All judging cards and plaques must be picked up at the show. Premium checks will be mailed.

RULES

All Local & State Rules Apply

1. All organizational codes of conduct will apply.
2. FFA/4-H/Grange exhibitors of livestock must wear the official show uniform of their organization while showing their animals. Independent Junior exhibitors of livestock must wear white or blue jeans and a white shirt (belts should be worn if belt loops are available).

4-H

1. 4-H entries are open to all 4-H members in Contra Costa County.
2. Members competing at the Fair must be regularly enrolled in 4-H and can exhibit until the end of the calendar year in which member is 19. They must complete their project as required by the 4-H Program.

FUTURE FARMERS OF AMERICA

1. Future Farmers entries in livestock will be open to members of chapters in Contra Costa, San Joaquin, and Solano counties.
2. Future Farmers entries in Agriculture/Horticulture will be open to members of chapters in Contra Costa, Alameda, Solano and San Joaquin counties.
3. Students competing in this division must be regularly enrolled in High School Vocational Agriculture and must meet the requirements, rules and regulations set up by the C.A.T.A. and the State Association of FFA.
4. All entries in this division must be from projects carried as a part of the regular High School Agricultural Program and must be owned by the student.

GRANGE

1. Grange entries are open to all Grange members in Contra Costa County.
2. Grange members competing at the Fair must be at least 5 years old on January 1, 2009 to exhibit. They may exhibit until the end of the calendar year in which they reach age 19. All Grange members must be at least 9 years old on January 1, 2009 to exhibit large animals.
2. Grange exhibitors 13 years and under, will show in 4-H classes; 14 years and older, will show in FFA classes, unless numbers warrant separate classes or otherwise stated. Fair Management will determine class size.

INDEPENDENT JUNIOR EXHIBITORS

1. Entries are open to all Junior Exhibitors in Contra Costa County and must meet state rule and grade requirements. Exhibitor must not have been a 4-H/FFA/Grange member for 60 days prior to the Fair.
2. Independent Junior exhibitors not affiliated with a junior organization may enter appropriate 4-H/FFA/Grange classes for which they can qualify. No exhibit will be received unless parent or guardian has signed entry form. The entry exhibited must be the legitimate property of the youth exhibitor. The independent junior exhibitor must follow delivery and release times applying to 4-H/FFA/Grange members.
3. Independent exhibitors, 13 years and under, will show in 4-H classes; 14 years and older will show in FFA classes unless numbers warrant separate classes or otherwise stated. Fair Management will determine class size.
4. All Independent Junior exhibitors are required to have insurance. Insurance may be purchased through the Fair.

CONTRA COSTA FAIR CODE OF CONDUCT

1. The following guidelines are designed to make your experience at Fair events satisfying to you and to all others attending.
2. The possession and use of alcoholic beverages and/or drugs, or other than prescription medication is prohibited; participants are not to smoke in group meetings or in sleeping areas.
3. Setting off of fire alarms or tampering with fire extinguishing equipment or other emergency equipment is prohibited.
4. Gambling and betting by adults and youth while an exhibitor at the Fair is prohibited.
5. Obscene and discriminatory language, roughhousing, and insubordination will not be tolerated at any time.
6. Youth members and volunteers should demonstrate respect for one another.
7. Display of overly affectionate attention between participants is discouraged.
8. All participants are to be in their assigned area at curfew and to comply with the quiet hours, lights out, and other rules of the event.
9. All youth exhibitors must be supervised by an adult at all times.

ENTERING THE FAIR

Use one entry form for each species

Entry forms and fees must be received at the Fair Office by May 5, 2009.

(The Fair asks all project or community leaders to collect all fees and provide only one check.)

2. Entry forms must be signed by the project or community leader to be eligible.
3. All market animal exhibitors are required to provide the **Bill of Sale for their animal attached to their entry form. If the exhibitor bred the animal, please note that on a separate sheet, attached to the entry form.**

EXHIBITING

1. Exhibits will remain on exhibit for the duration of the Fair unless noted otherwise. Exhibits must be maintained and kept in working order.
2. State Rule IV-6 will apply in all divisions unless noted otherwise. No exhibitor may receive more than two awards per class and moneys will be advanced accordingly.
3. Note: During the Fair, Junior Exhibitors ONLY are allowed to handle, prepare and care for their animals. Adult assistance is allowed when there is a safety issue or as needed in regards to child capabilities. (ie: weight, size, school schedules, use of power tools, etc). Acceptable adult assistance is at the discretion of Fair Management.
4. County, district and state fairs cannot legally carry liability insurance covering junior exhibitors and/or their exhibits. Liability insurance is the responsibility and at the discretion of the parent/guardian of the Junior exhibitor. Therefore, it is suggested that Junior exhibitors consider taking out a liability policy covering themselves and their exhibits.
5. All entries must have been made, collected, grown or prepared and entered by exhibitors within one year of the opening date of the Fair, except as otherwise noted.

LIVESTOCK RULES

1. Anyone not following the rules is subject to elimination from exhibiting by the Livestock Superintendent.
2. An individual exhibitor may not enter more than one market lamb, one market swine and one market beef and one market goat. There is no limit on the total number of animals exhibited.
3. All animals must be placed in pens assigned.
4. No animals will be muzzled on the fairgrounds.
See State Rule VIII-15.
5. Bedding will be sold, if available, from feed store.

- Store hours to be determined. **Shavings only will be allowed. NO STRAW.**
6. No animal overly fatigued or stressed will be weighed.
 7. Animals consigned to market will not receive premium money.
 8. All animal pens are to be cleaned between 6 am – 10 am Thursday - Friday, and between 6 am – 9 am on Saturday and Sunday.
 9. All exhibits will be inspected daily. Condition of the animals, condition of stalls, pen and aisles, neatness and orderliness of areas used for tack and equipment will be evaluated. **No brooms are to be used in dirt areas of the barn.** Exhibitors who leave any animal in filthy condition will:
 - A) Forfeit premiums after 2 warnings.
 - B) Be sent home after 3 warnings.
 10. Livestock exhibitors and parents are held responsible for all State Rules.
 11. **Ownership:** Exhibitors must be the bonafide owners of all entries for 60 days prior to opening day of Fair, except that market beef animals must be owned for 120 days prior to the opening day of Fair and beef replacement heifers must be owned by December 15, 2006. The management may demand such proof of ownership as it deems necessary.
 12. **No personal scales will be allowed on the Fairgrounds.**
 13. Individuals wishing to pre-weigh their market animals, will be weighed on the fair scales immediately after unloading, before they reach their designated pens.
 14. Only one pre-weigh will be allowed
 15. Once an animal has been brought to the fairgrounds it cannot be removed without approval from the Livestock Superintendent.
 16. After weighing, market animals will be assigned to proper classes for judging. If there is any question concerning weight, animals must be re-weighed immediately, without exercising or leaving the area.
 17. Animals sifted because of weight may be released and may be removed from the Fairgrounds at the discretion of the Livestock Superintendent if pen space is needed.
 18. The management shall reserve the right to examine any or all animals. Any animal shown by the examination to be diseased shall be immediately removed from the Fairgrounds. The management will under no circumstances be liable in any way for such removal.

19. No one will be allowed to sleep in barn area.
20. There will be a 10 p.m. curfew in the barn.
21. Registration papers for breeding animals must be checked at the Livestock Office before judging or animal will be automatically disqualified. No copies of registration papers allowed. See State Rules VIII and IX.
22. Once an animal has been shown in one organization, 4-H, FFA, or Grange, it cannot be shown in the other organization during the current project year.
23. No junior exhibitor may exhibit a market animal, which has been sold through a Fair livestock auction whether or not there is an actual change of ownership.
24. Any animal marked by a tattoo as sold shall not be exhibited at any fair.
25. Exhibitors must be present at the time of judging, showing and selling of his/her livestock unless the Livestock Superintendent approves otherwise.
26. No dogs will be allowed on the Fairgrounds except under special circumstances. Permission must be in writing.
27. Animals are not allowed outside the barn area.
28. **Release slips** will be required to remove exhibits from Fairgrounds. Obtain release from Livestock Office prior to departure.
29. **Registered animals:** Once application for pure-bred registry has been made, animals will be considered as registered, and original registration papers will be required to show. Such animals are not eligible to show in grade and unregistered divisions.
30. Only exhibitors and staff will be allowed in the arena, holding pens or holding pen aisle.
31. While in the Livestock Arena or holding pens area, **ALL cell phones must be off.**
32. No barn animals or exhibit material are to be removed before exhibit release time. A loss of premium money may occur if this rule is not adhered to.
33. All pen kickboards must be placed on the inside of the pen. Any boards attached on the outside of the livestock pens will be removed.



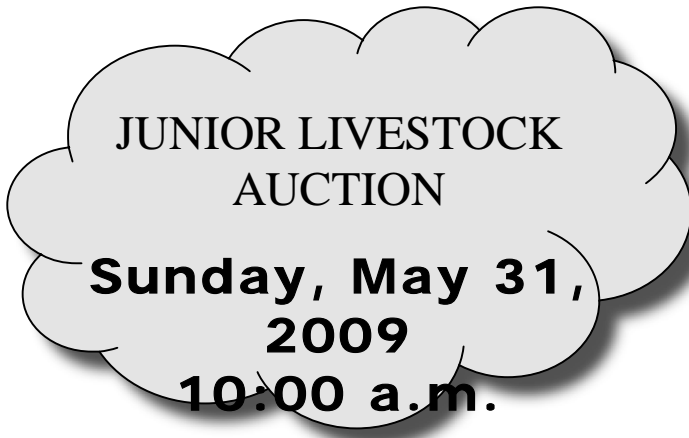
AUCTION RULES

1. Sale animals will be released as directed by Management.
2. Warrants in payment of sale will be awarded as payment is received from the buyer.
3. **Qualification to sell:**
 Beef Market Ready
 Hogs, Lamb Market Ready
 Market Goats Market Ready
 Poultry Champion Lightweight Pen,
 Champion Heavyweight Pen
 Rabbits Champion Pen & Champion
 Single Fryer

Turkeys Best Hen & Best Tom
(each organization if numbers warrant)

4. Eggs Grand Champion Eggs
One exhibitor may sell no more than four animals at auction: and not more than 1 beef, 1 hog, 1 lamb, or 1 market goat unless the following occurs.
 A) **All Champion and Reserve Champions must be sold at auction.** In the event there are 3 or more champions or reserve champions owned by one exhibitor, this ruling will take precedence.
5. Private treaties are available **ONLY** for the following animals:
 A) Overweight and underweight
 B) Animals sifted from the show for inferior quality.
 C) There will be a \$35 processing fee for all private treaties.
6. Exhibitors have up to 1 hour after completion of that specie show to scratch animals from the sale to take home. **After 1 hour after the show, exhibitors will be charged a \$10 processing fee.**
7. **Beef Requirements:**
 A) All cattle coming to or going from the Fair must be accompanied by the transport-ation form supplied by the fair. Cattle coming to the Fair to be offered for sale must also have the Bill of Sale or Consignment (form 74-046), and proper proof of ownership signed by parent. Proper proof of ownership may consist of a brand inspection certificate or a sales-yard out billing in the exhibitor's name.
 B) Cattle originating out of California must be accompanied by a brand inspection certificate and health certificate if required by originating state. If you have any questions, call your local brand inspector.
 C) Any steer entering the Fairgrounds without the above will be disqualified from judging and sale.
8. The exhibitor **MUST** be present at the auction to sell any animal unless management approves otherwise.
9. No animal may be sold more than once. There will be no resale for charity or other purposes.
10. A 6% charge of the purchase price of each animal sold at auction will be assessed by the Contra Costa County Fair in order to defray defaults of payments by buyers, incidental auction expenses and other contingencies, which may arise.
11. All animals destined for processing after the auction should be delivered only to

- licensed processing plants. (Sections 357-359 of California Agriculture Code.)
12. Any animal not accepted by the processing plant and verified "unfit" by a veterinarian or qualified inspector will be replaced by responsible party.
 13. Sale Order: Swine, champion poultry pen, eggs, best hen and tom turkeys, beef, champion rabbit pen, market goats, sheep.



4-H, FFA & GRANGE SPECIAL

The following special awards have been donated to the FFA and 4-H. exhibitors. We are grateful to the donors for their cooperation in helping to make the Fair successful and for their support of these projects.

Western States Angus Auxiliary: (2184 South, 1200 East, Bliss, ID, 83314) will present an award to the outstanding 4-H and/or outstanding FFA Exhibitor. The selection of the winner is based on show ring placing of individual animals, placing in showmanship and educational display. The following point system must be followed:

If steers and breeding animals are both exhibited, points may be combined to select a winner. For breeding animals, the animal must be registered with papers. This is open to exhibitors with one or more breeding and/or market animals. Winning the award in previous years shall not exclude an exhibitor from winning again. For market steers, this award should go to the highest placing predominately black steer, the sire must be Angus. "It must be kept in mind that the purpose of this award is the promotion of the Angus breed, therefore,

Angus breeding animals should take precedence over market animals."



DECORATED PENS

Division 181 - Best Decorated Pens using Fair Theme

The Fair will provide a \$25 award up to 20 clubs for decorating beyond the minimum requirements. If without merit, the judge shall make no award.

Decorated Pens

Minimum Requirements:

Each club must have a sign that designates their name and area, and all animals must have an ID card, with owner's name, on the pen.

To be eligible for an award, pens must be decorated using the Fair theme, have some educational value, imagination will be taken into consideration. Decorations must be a product of the youth exhibitors.

Suggested use of plants, plastic, cloth, metal or cardboard. Full sheets of plywood are not recommended. Pen decorations must be up by 1 p.m. on Thursday, opening day.

Class

1. Decorated Pens

State Fire Marshal Regulations must be followed:

1. No display or exhibit shall be installed or operated that will interfere in any way with access to any exit or with the visibility of any exit sign. No display shall block access to fire fighting equipment, such as fire extinguisher stations, fire hose cabinets and fire hydrants or access by fire suppression vehicles or equipment.
2. No display, exhibit, booth or temporary construction shall be built of highly combustible material.
3. Any paper or fabric used in displays or exhibits shall be fire resistive or treated with an approved fire retarding solution prior to use. Documentation of such shall be available during any inspection.
4. Exhibitors must be able to show proof of using fire retardant material by receipt, empty package, etc. 4-H and FFA judged together. Education information encouraged.

SHOWMANSHIP American Judging System

Rules:

1. Pre-registration is required. List division and class number on the entry form for that specie.

2. Only animals owned, fitted and entered by the exhibitor in its own class are eligible.
3. Horses that are owned or leased are eligible to be shown in showmanship.
4. Exhibitors shall be on hand and ready to show as scheduled.
5. Exhibitors are required to wear their official show uniform.
6. Not more than 20 exhibitors in a class at one time. The number in class will be decided by the Livestock Staff.
7. Exhibitors who are members of both 4-H and FFA are eligible to enter both 4-H and FFA Showmanship.
8. Grange exhibitors 13 years and under will show in 4-H classes; 14 years and older will show in FFA classes.

Open to exhibitors in their 1st year in exhibiting that animal specie. An exhibitor can participate & exhibit this specie in other competitions within the 1st year of the project. Top 3 winners may compete in the Advanced Class.

Division 183- FFA Advanced Showmanship

Open to all members who have previously shown that species and to the top 3 winners of the FFA 1st Year class.

Division 184 - 4-H 1st Year Showmanship

Open to exhibitors in their 1st year in exhibiting that animal specie. An exhibitor can participate & exhibit this specie in other competitions within the 1st year of the project. Top 3 winners may compete in the Advanced Class.

Division 185 - 4-H Jr. Showmanship

Open to exhibitors 13 years old and under (as of show date) exhibiting that animal specie. Top 3 winners may compete in the 4-H Advanced Class.

Division 186 - 4-H 14 Years old and over (Advanced)

Open to all members who have previously shown that species and to the top 3 winners of the 4-H 1st Year class.

MASTER SHOWMANSHIP

Rules:

1. A member who wins Master Showmanship may compete again in Master Showmanship, but is not eligible to enter into Master Showmanship from winning the same specie as before.
2. A member may only enter Master Showmanship in one department. In the event a member wins 2 specie classes, the second place contestant may enter Master Showmanship in the specie not entered by the first place winner.
3. All exhibitors will handle and show each species. These animals will be picked at random. Scores will be a ranking, 1 to 10.

Division 190 - Master Showmanship

Large Animal

A buckle will be awarded to the 4-H/FFA/Grange winner of all around showmanship of the 6 kinds of livestock: beef, sheep, swine, dairy goat, meat goat and horse.

Division 191 - Master Showmanship

Small Animal

A buckle will be awarded to the 4-H/FFA/Grange winner of all around showmanship of the 6 kinds of small animals: rabbit, poultry, pigeon, dog, cavy and pygmy goat.

SHEEP LEAD

Rules:

1. All exhibitors judged together
2. Registration by May 5th is required.
3. Entrant must furnish own costume of at least 70% wool. Outfit may be purchased or hand-made by exhibitor.
4. Ownership of lamb is not required. Contestant is responsible to make arrangements to borrow an animal if necessary. The lamb used for this contest must be entered in the Fair.
5. Sheep must be shown at halter and must be ewe lamb, yearling ewe or wether. NO RAMS.
6. Instructions for commentary format and complete contest information will be given to entrants after close of entries.
7. Winner of each class may be eligible for State Fair Best of Show.

HORSE RIDING

Please note: riding classes will be held on Saturday, May 16, 2009 at 8:00 a.m.

Rules

1. Entry qualifications:

- a) Horse being shown must be the member's project horse at least 120 days prior to the show and be recorded in project record book. (i.e. leasing of horses is acceptable).
 - b) Current Horse ID, medical release, emergency waiver, horse permission to treat, code of conduct and liability waiver are on file with Horse Resource Leader and received by appropriate deadline (January 1 of current year). New members have 30 days after joining to complete paperwork.
 - c) No member may show a horse that is not their own properly ID project horse.
2. **Pony Requirements:** Entries in pony classes must be of pony or mixed pony breed. 14.2 hands or under. Ponies are to be shown in pony classes only, except in Horsemanship and Western Riding. Ponies can/will be measured prior to the start of the show.
 3. **Walk/Jog Classes:** Riders/horses are not eligible to compete in any class(es), which require loping. Walk/jog classes are for members who do not/have never loped.
 4. **Age Requirements:** 4-H Exhibitors shall show in their respective divisions based upon their age as of January 1st, regardless of their age at the time of showing. Juniors will be defined as 13 and

under. Seniors will be defined as 14 or older.

5. Uniform/Apparel requirements:

Appropriate attire and tack for the Western, English and Gymkhana Classes must be used. All riders will wear approved, secured, protective headgear when mounted. If headgear has a brim, it must be flexible or semi flexible. Any rider violating this rule at any time will immediately be prohibited from further riding until his/her headgear is properly in place.

6. Each entrant will provide all necessary equipment and horse/pony to compete in this competition.

7. Any changes in the Horse Show scheduling will be announced at the Horse Show areas on the day of the show. *Such announcements shall be deemed sufficient notice to exhibitors.*

8. Any rider who leaves the arena after the class begins will not be allowed to re-enter, unless approved by the judge. Exhibitors are not eligible if they or their horse/horses have *trained under the judge within 90 days of the show date.*

9. Exhibitors are required to care for, prepare for showing, and show their own animals. **Adult help (including parents/trainers) in grooming, exercising and preparing for the show, or actually showing of the animals at horse show may cause the member and/or animal to be disqualified.** No coaching on rails. ONLY encouragement appreciated.

10. Ownership: See State Rule XI-10.

11. The judge/management may disqualify any animal that is not sufficiently gentle to be shown with safety. Substitutions are permitted only in cases of illness or injury of animal with a vet certificate. The substitute must be member's own project animal, been previously ID and reported on in the member's record book.

12. Unless other rules are specified, rules and definitions for conducting each judged class (English/Western) as contained in the *West Coast Horse Show Rule Book* and for each Gymkhana Class as contained in the *California Horseman's Association Rule Book* will apply to this horse show.
