Flora humbly says this garden half planted itself. "If you're staying put longer than three years, all you have to do is buy one of these plants to get whole drifts started. Plants that reseed themselves are often drought tolerant and come up in places that are already friendly to them. This way, there's not much tending, except to get out of their way. They show up in places you would never think to plant something, and so resemble patterns in nature."
